



Dr Libby Connors is a senior lecturer in history at the University of Southern Queensland Toowoomba and author of *Warrior* the book which won the Premier's Prize of the 2015 Queensland Literary Awards.

*Warrior* tells the story of the dramatic life and death of Dundalli, who was an Aboriginal lawman who came up against the supreme court of New South Wales and continued to defy colonialism even from the gallows.

A physical giant of a man falsely accused and a living legend, he had evaded capture for 14 years before being publicly hanged in Brisbane in 1855.

Dr Connors is coming to Canberra to commemorate the frontier wars during this year's Anzac season.

She will speaking at the Frontier Wars Story Telling Camp at the Aboriginal Tent Embassy on the afternoon of Friday 22 April (3.00 pm).

Later that evening (5.30 pm) she will present a public lecture at Manning Clark House on the theme "One Aboriginal leader and the different phases of the frontier wars".

On Monday 25 April she will be participating in the Anzac Day Lest We Forget the Frontier Wars March to the Australian War Memorial.
