A series of events to remember and explore the significance of Australia's vote against conscription in October 1916.

During World War I, Australians twice went to referendum and twice voted to reject the forced conscription of soldiers into the war. While millions of federal dollars have been spent in the last few years on the ANZAC centenary, the historic campaigns against conscription – and their legacy - have been all but officially ignored.
